Another GREAT WMCC FALL COLOR TOUR weekend in the books, 13 beautiful CAMAROs all made it to Fay's on Thursday night. 11 starting in Coopersville and 1 joining in Big Rapids and 1 at Lake Station on M-10. THANKX to all who attended, I truly believe it is the people and the camaraderie that make the weekend so great. THANK YOU.

THURSDAY started at the Speedway in Coopersville and quickly got moved to the Shell station right next door after finding out how much truck traffic there was going through the Speedway station. South on 68<sup>th</sup> to Eastmanville, left on Leonard, sun in our eyes, it was a great start, weather perfect, cool and sunny. North on 14<sup>th</sup> making our way through Marne, over to Kenowa,

north through the patchwork fields and orchards, rolling hills, all great in the sunshine. First stop High Rollaway on M-82 just east of Newaygo. One of Doug's favorite spots, colors not in full bloom yet but still good color, even in the parking lot. Leaving there and taking the back way into Newaygo from the east, down the hill and hitting M-37 at the light in town, over the river and right on Croton rd. to the Dam area. This year heading up the east side from Croton to Hardy dam. Crossing the dam and turning north on Elm and what I call Old M-20 into Big Rapids, East out of town on 16 mile making our way to Chippewa Lake with the sun still hanging in there. East on Colman rd. through Barrington to Brinton rd., north to Lake Station. A quick stop at Citgo and the last member of our group catching up we were off to Clair for lunch at Ruckles Pier. Nice hometown Bar/ Restaurant, good service and good food.

From Clair over to Beaverton and up M-18 through Gladwin, starting to see the clouds now coming

down from the north. North of Gladwin we caught F-97 north and ran that up to St. Helen, Lake St. Helen is a good size lake but the roads we took didn't give you a very good view of it. On up to Lynn Dewy's place we meet some neat car people and viewed Lynn's collection in progress.

I think everybody from both groups had a good time there.

North up to M-72 and then west into Grayling and get settled into Fay's for the night.

FRIDAY morning was cloudy and the cars were wet from the dew, weather report was slight chance of rain west of I-75,(lake effect). We headed north on old US-127 to Gaylord to view the Elk at the Elk Ranch which is next to the Elks Club, go figure. More animals this year but smaller. East out of Gaylord to county rd. F-44 up around Tree Tops golf and resort area. Very hilly and beautiful area. Heading north the mist just starting to come down now. Even though we



are east of I-75, not bad though, you could still enjoy the colors and hillsides. Getting into Levering for a potty stop John Falkenhagen puts it best, sitting in his car, radio on, now it's pouring and the weather comes on slight chance of a sprinkle!

Up Old 127 a short distance to C-48 heading over to Boyne Falls, take a right on Slashing RD. roads are still wet but the rain has stopped for the most part. This is a great road to nowhere. Fairly new pavement winding up the hillside, perfect Camaro road, then the pavement stops and we turn around



and back to C-48. At Boyne Falls we head north on US-131 to Walloon Lake and back east to River Rd. taking that north into Petoskey from the south. Lunch and shopping in down town Petoskey for a couple of hrs. Now we are on the lake shore and the sun came back out to make for a better day. Over to the city complex where the Bear river dumps into the bay there is a couple of manmade waterfalls, fishermen but no fish. Even run into some new members who were on a family fishing outing. South out of Petoskey on McDougal going right, left, right, left, left, left, right and so on around and up to M-68 and into the Indian River area with a stop at the Cross In The Woods. For those of you that aren't familiar with the place it is a 40' tall Cross erected in the woods with a worship area and gift store. They do hold outdoor services there weather permitting. With the night being young and my plans over some of the members went north to Mackinaw City and the rest headed south to Fay's taking both the



freeway and the old rd.

SATURDAY, up and on the road around 9:30 again lead us out M-72 east to F-97, this time going north and turning onto North Downriver RD. another good road for the vista. 
