Like I said in April we will be starting in Port Huron on Thursday the 7th of October. Leaving from the Holiday Inn Express at 9am. I will do the basic route then Motel info at the bottom. Day 1 October 7th we will be traveling up the Huron lake shore around the thumb area, through Bay City and on up to Alpena for the first night. We will be staying at the Big Bear Motel right on US-23 on the south end of town. 2021 Making Memories ROUTE 66 TOUR September 9-22, 2021

First off, I would like to thank the participants this year that make the trip. Making the trip this year was, Dave and Gay Verburg, John Jr., Roxie Smith, Ed and Ann Boher from West Virginia, (Michelle Malmquist's dad and stepmom) and Jim and Lynn Garrett from North Carolina. Friends of Michelle's Thank you for going. Deb Peloquin joined for the Meet and Greet and a little over halfway the first day. It was nice to see Deb again.

The trip started with a meet and greet at Dell Rhea's Chicken Basket in Willowbrook IL. on Thursday night Sept. 9th. Dell Rhea's Chicken Basket opened on Route 66 in the summer of 1946 and is still thriving today.

On Friday the 10th, we headed out at 9am spending the first night in Carlinville IL. at the Carlinvilla Motel. Along the way we visited two old Gas Stations the Log Cabin Restaurant which was rotated back in history to have the front face the 66 after it moved to the back of the building, The Route 66 Museum in Pontiac IL.

On Sat. we headed to Missouri to spend the night at the Wagon Wheel Motel in Cuba MO. Stopping at 500 Classics Cars along the side of I-55in IL., over to the Missouri Route 66 Museum west of ST. Louis, then tour the town of Cuba that has 19 Murals painted on the sides of buildings telling the history.

Sunday, we made it to Joplin MO. with attractions of the largest rocking chair, Devil's Elbow, Uranus Fudge Factory.

Monday, we made it just west of OKC to El Reno OK. making stops at the Blue Whale, Seaba Station Motorcycle Museum, Big Round Barn, we did get there late and missed the inside. and the largest Pop bottle.

Tuesday, the next motel was in Shamrock TX. with stops in Elk City OK for two museums OK Route 66 Museum and The National Route 66 Museum with the high lite of the day being a stop to see Harley, a legend on 66.

Wednesday, we started with a stop at the U-Drop Inn, Bug Ranch, the Big Texan in Amarillo where you can get a 24oz. steak for free if you eat the whole meal in an hour. Cadillac Ranch, and the Halfway point before going to Tucumcari New Mexico and the Blue Swallow Motel.

Thursday, we stopped in Santa Rosa NM at the Route 66 Auto Museum before heading to Santa Fe.

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NM, it is on an early pre 1932 alignment of Route 66, in Jeff's words just the drive through the mountains is worth it.

Friday down to Albuquerque with a stop at Old Town then over to Gallup NM for the night at EL Rancho Hotel, El Rancho was built in the early 1920s and used by a lot of movies as a home base when filming western moves in the countryside with lots of pic in the grand stair case.

Saturday crossing over into Arizona hitting the Painted Desert/Petrified Forest National Park and spending the night in Holbrook to sleep in a Wigwam Motel.

Sunday the first stop would be Winslow AZ. to stand on the Corner then a right turn in Flag Staff up to the Grand Canyon. then back down to Seligman AZ spending the night at the Stagecoach Motel, Cheryl and I got to sleep in the John Wayne room.

Monday would be one of most memorable days of the trip as we make our way to Needles CA. by the way of Hackberry Store, Kingman and onto the Oatman Highway through the Black Mountains into Oatman AZ. They have Burrows walking the streets, left over from the gold mining days.

Tuesday we would travel through a lot of desert to get to Barstow CA. we hit Amboy CA to stop at Roy's Café in the middle of nowhere. Café' is closed now but there is a two-pump gas station and souvenir shop with porta potties. Then the Bag Dad Café that was featured in a movie that was more popular in Europe.


