Chevy Camaro Must Become Less Expensive To See Next-Gen: Exclusive By Alex Luft

Since GM officially announced plans to <u>discontinue the sixth-generation Chevy</u> <u>Camaro</u>, enthusiasts have been on edge for info about the future of the storied muscle car. What we've heard thus far has been all over the place, starting with <u>remarks from Chevy chief Scott Bell</u>, who was quoted as saying in a March 2023 press release that the discontinuation of the sixth-gen model "is not the end of the Camaro story." Beyond that, we've also heard some comments stating that the <u>Camaro should return as an</u> <u>electric performance car</u> and even as <u>family of</u> <u>battery electric performance cars</u>. Now, *GM Authority* is here to bring you the latest.

What we're hearing from sources close to the matter are two things.

First, GM has not given up on resurrecting the <u>Camaro</u>. This lines up with what Bell told us back in May 2024, namely to "<u>never say never</u>" when it comes to the muscle car returning in the future.

Second, product planners have landed on at least one aspect in the direction for the next-gen model. Sources who asked to remain anonymous tell *GM Authority* that the mantra surrounding any possibility of the next-gen <u>Chevy</u> Camaro is that it must be "affordable and attainable", certainly more so than the sixth-generation Camaro.

Another source familiar with GM's internal Camaro discussions tells *GMA* that "affordability is a priority" for the next-gen model, adding that a successor to the sixth-gen is unlikely unless lower price points are reached.

The lower price / value mantra makes sense. After all, affordability and value was what the Camaro was all about during its first three

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generations. It's also one of the key elements that enabled the <u>Corvette C8</u> to become a home run. In fact, the <u>C8 Stingray</u> – which <u>launched at</u> <u>an attainable \$59K starting price</u> for the base model – has attracted a <u>younger customer base</u>, one that prior <u>Corvette</u> models haven't been able to draw.

In much the same way, the next-gen Camaro will need to capture a much younger audience with a value play. That's something that the sixth-gen Camaro did on the surface, but that value proposition started to slip as options and/or high (er)-performance models were added to the build.

It's currently unclear whether attaining a low price point will carry another cost, like removing features or options. We'll be here to tell you more when we have it, so stay tuned and be sure to <u>subscribe</u> to *GM Authority* for more <u>Chevy</u> <u>Camaro news</u> and <u>Chevy news</u>.

Next-Gen Chevy Camaro: What Base Engine Should It Get?

With the <u>discontinuation</u> of the sixthgeneration <u>Chevy Camaro</u> following the conclusion of the 2024 model year, speculation is rampant over what lies ahead for the iconic GM nameplate. Currently, the most likely scenario is <u>a pivot to all-electric power</u>, but that doesn't mean ICE-based power is completely off the table. Which leads us to ask – if GM chooses the ICE route, what would the automaker use for the next-gen <u>Chevy</u> Camaro base engine?

As *GM Authority* exclusively reported last week, GM intends to make the next-generation Camaro <u>significantly more affordable</u> than its predecessor, suggesting that a smaller, more efficient engine could be in the cards. With that, let's dive into some potential candidates:

Turbo 2.0L I4 LTG Engine

Although the <u>LTG</u> is no longer produced, it was last available under the hood of the <u>2023 Chevy</u> <u>Camaro</u> delivering 275 horsepower and 295 pound-feet of torque. However, the LTG was later either discontinued or replaced across GM's lineup.

Turbo 2.0L I4 LSY Engine

One of the engines that replaced the LTG was the LSY, which delivers between 228 and 237

horsepower, depending on application, as well as 258 pound-feet of torque. While peak output aligns with affordable <u>competitors like the Subaru</u> <u>BRZ and Toyota GR86</u>, it falls short of the Ford Mustang EcoBoost's 315 horsepower. Even so, the LSY might keep costs low enough to justify a spot in the Camaro lineup.

Turbo 2.7L I4 L3B Engine

The turbocharged <u>2.7L I4 L3B</u> can be found in a variety of GM products, including several different pickups and even the <u>Cadillac CT4</u> sedan. Output is rated up to 325 horsepower with 380 pound-feet of torque in the <u>CT4-V</u>, and 310 horsepower with 430 pound-feet of torque in the trucks. The L3B is also compatible with the <u>GM Alpha</u> <u>platform</u>, the same underpinnings as the sixthgen Camaro, which could streamline validation and development.

Twin-Turbo 3.0L V6 LGY Engine

Firts introduced with the <u>Cadillac CT5</u>, the <u>LGY</u> delivers output ranging between 335 horsepower and 360 horsepower, plus 405 pound -feet of torque. Like the L3B, the LGY is already cradled by the Alpha platform, potentially easing development costs.

Turbo 2.5L I4 LK0 Engine

The turbocharged <u>2.5L I4 LK0</u> is the newest engine option on the list, powering the latest <u>Chevy Traverse</u>, <u>GMC Acadia</u>, and <u>Buick</u> <u>Enclave</u> with 328 horsepower and 326 pound-feet of torque. As it turns out, GM developed the LK0 as a solution for the Traverse / Acadia / Enclave due to issues fitting the crossovers with the L3B in a transverse layout, but given the Camaro's engine bay should be large to fit the L3B, the LK0 is less likely to be used for the next-gen sports car.

With <u>GM phasing out its naturally aspirated V6</u> <u>engines</u>, the Turbo 2.7L I4 L3B seems to be the strongest candidate here due to its impressive performance and packaging, although the turbocharged 2.0L LSY may also be a good candidate thanks to its affordability. Ultimately, however, the choice of powerplant will reflect GM's ongoing balancing act between performance, cost, and emissions standards – all key factors in shaping the Camaro's next chapter.

Which engine would you prefer?

Should The Next-Gen Chevy Camaro Be A Ford Mustang Or Toyota GR86 And Subaru BRZ Rival?

GM <u>discontinued</u> the sixth-generation <u>Chevy</u> <u>Camaro</u> following the conclusion of the 2024 model year, much to the dismay of fans. Nevertheless, this isn't the first time the Camaro nameplate has been killed off, with GM previously giving it the axe in 2002 before the launch of the fifth-gen in 2009 for the 2010 model year. Indeed, we wouldn't be surprised to see GM launch an all-new, seventhgeneration <u>Chevy</u> Camaro sometime in the next several years. However, the question is this – what form should it take?

It should go without saying that the most popular option is likely to be to maintain Chevy's longstanding rivalry with Ford and the Ford Mustang, a tradition dating back to the Camaro's launch in 1966 for the 1967 model year. At present, the Mustang is the last nameplate standing in its segment, with recent updates like the Dark Horse trim pushing the ICE-based performance boundaries even further. For many enthusiasts, the answer is obvious – V8 engine up front, power in the rear.

That said, developing an all-new, V8-powered sports car would be hugely expensive and likely untenable in the face of broader industry trends. As such, the Camaro could pivot to a sport compact model aimed at competitors like the Toyota GR86, Subaru BRZ, and Mazda MX-5. This would likely keep the Camaro relatively affordable, with powertrain offerings like the turbocharged <u>2.5L I4 LK0</u> gasoline engine under the hood. For the sake of comparison, the Toyota GR86 / Subaru BRZ twins feature a naturally aspirated 2.4L flat-four engine producing 228 horsepower, while the MX-5 is equipped with a 2.0L I4 producing 181 horsepower. All three models favor low weight and driver-friendly handling over straight-line performance, and enjoy a good deal of success among enthusiasts.

The most likely direction, however, is an electrified Camaro, as <u>hinted by GM President</u> <u>Mark Reuss</u>. Indeed, the EV muscle car landscape is growing, with this Stellantis' debut of the 2<u>024 Dodge Charger Daytona</u> boasting 670 horsepower and a 0-to-60 mph time of 3.3 seconds. A next-gen Camaro EV could directly compete in this space, showcasing GM's <u>Ultium</u> <u>battery technology</u> and advanced powertrains.

There are other developments to consider here, as well. Toyota, for example, is eyeing a revival of the Celica, while <u>Honda has teased a new</u> <u>Prelude</u>, the latter of which will likely cradle a hybrid powertrain. Mazda may even get in on the action with a new EREV (extended-range electric vehicle) juiced by a two-rotor electric generator.

That said, we still want to know – what direction would *you* prefer to see for the next-gen Chevy Camaro?
